One of Victoria's most remarkable natural attractions, the unique salt lake environment of Lake Tyrrell, will get a new visitor information and tourism infrastructure thanks to \$2.3 million from the Andrews Labor Government.

Lake Tyrrell is Victoria's largest salt lake and is especially popular with visitors from China Victoria's largest market for inbound tourists, which is expected to contribute up to 60 percent of tourism spend by 2025.

When complete, the \$2.58 million project is expected to boost the lake's current visitation numbers from 42,000 a year to more than 192,000 by 2025.

The project, a priority for the Mallee Regional Partnership, will deliver Tourism Infrastructure a range of new facilities including a boardwalk, interpretive signage, walking tracks, a viewing area, accessible toilets, waste management infrastructure, and parking with turnaround space for

The project will create six jobs during construction and once complete, it is forecast to contribute more than \$6.9 million to the local economy.

As visitation to the area increases along with demand for accommodation, new businesses will be established in surrounding towns like Sea Lake to service the growing market.

The Lake Tyrrell Tourism Infrastructure Development Project is funded by the Labor Government's flagship Regional

Fund, which is investing in iconic regional tourism projects that create world-class tourism experiences, support jobs and boost the regional economy.

Minister for Regional Development, Jaala Pulford, said making Lake Tyrrell more accessible to more visitors from around the world will showcase the largest and most spectacular salt lake, and bring more people to Victoria's north west.

"The Andrews Labor Government is proud to back this project that is creating jobs and putting the Mallee well and truly on the map as an iconic nature-based destination for visitors," she said.

Minister for Tourism and Major Events, John

Eren, said this work will welcome thousands more visitors to Lake Tyrrell each year - creating new jobs and local business opportunities in the region.

Buloke Shire Council Director Works and Technical Services, Anthony Judd, said the Lake Tyrrell Tourism Infrastructure Development Project will create a 'pipeline' of tourism infrastructure projects for private and public sector development which is good news for tourism and local businesses.

Promhelis Director, Jarrod Danahay, said Promhelis is a newly established helicopter scenic flight business operating from Sea Lake.

"We pride ourselves in showcasing the beauty of Lake Tyrrell and its
